Step-By-Step Protocol for Confronting Threats
of Violence or Intimidation Against Voters

ASSESS

- Is violence already occurring or does violence feel imminent?
 - Call Attorney General Balderas's election security hotline immediately: (505) 318-1008
- Are you trained in de-escalation techniques?
 - If so and you feel you can do so safely, consider attempting to de-escalate the situation.

DOCUMENT

- Document the situation as thoroughly as possible.
 - See the attached questionnaire to guide you through.
 - Email it to info@olenm.org
- Is the situation causing voters to leave without voting?
 - If possible, collect contact information so we can tell voters when it is safe to return.
